

Embroidered Table Runner Instructions

Finished Runner 60"x12 1/2"

Materials needed:

Scissor, cutting wheel, cutting board, Iron, matching thread and bobbin

12 ¹/₂" cutting square

Fusible Web Interfacing, approximately 1 yard

- 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ yard of material for 3 embroidered Blocks
- 1 yard of material for 2 decorative blocks
- 2 yards of material for backing

1 yard of material for the 2 strips between center block and binding

Instructions:

- 1. Cut 3 blocks of material into approximately 18" squares (this will be cut down after embroidering).
- 2. Cut 2 blocks of decorative material into 12 ¹/₂" squares.
- 3. Select 3 designs, spray adhesive to material and cut away stabilizer. Embroider all three designs.
- 4 .Cut the embroidered blocks to 12 ¹/₂" squares centering the embroidered design in the middle of each block. Suggestion: If you want the design to face a different direction than what it embroiders you may want to hoop the material so you can turn the square the way you want it after you embroider it.
- 5. Sew using a $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam, the 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips on each side of the center block.
- 6. Sew the rest of the blocks, using a $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam, together.



- 7. Iron the seams down on the back of the runner.
- 8. Cut back piece to match front piece of runner.
- 9. Apply the Fusible Web Interfacing to the back panel of the runner (iron to wrong side of material).
- 10. Place the Front and Backs together (wrong sides together) and pin in a couple of places.
- 11. To cut peaks on each end: Fold the end block in half and pin corner with openings. Place the open edges towards you and pin the corner. Take the 12 ½" square and place the end to the corner opposite you. Take the Square and rotate it until the 8" mark is on the end of the material facing towards you. Hold the square in place and cut along the edge of the square to make the peak. This will cut off the pinned corner of the material. Repeat the above steps for the other peak.

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12. Sewing the binding on: After you cut the four 2 ½" strips sew them together like you would for any binding project. Use a ½" seam to attach the binding to the table runner.



13. Your table runner is finished.
